Neighbor-To-Neighbor Mediation announces their 3-day training. This workshop is designed for trained mediators, school personnel, family counselors, youth workers, and those involved with working with teens and their families. *For mediators, this is considered 'advanced' and should be taken only after having completed a Basic Mediation Training.*

The training includes:

- History/Overview of P/T mediation
- Appropriate applications; referral sources
- Multi-stage/multi-session mediation process including caucus
- Screening & Intake
- Teen developmental considerations
- Biases and role of the mediator: Our “family values”
- Communication styles
- Co-mediation
- Dealing with the “Big” issues: trust, responsibility, freedom
- Case Management: roles & responsibilities, tracking, forms, mediator guidelines, debriefing cases, follow-up, working with referring agencies (youth shelters, Juvenile departments, CPS, schools, community)
- Roleplays

About the Trainer: Marc Steiner was the coordinator of one of the largest P/T mediation programs in the country in the 1990's, at the New Mexico Center for Dispute Resolution (500 referrals annually). Since then, he has helped design and train numerous youth programs in over 45 states including many DRC's in Washington State where he worked both on contract and as the Training & Practicum Director for the Pierce County DRC. He recently moved to Oregon and is the Executive Director of Neighbor-to-Neighbor Mediation.
