Restorative Justice (RJ) is a growing movement to respond constructively to crime and other harms. It takes seriously the needs of victims and their right to have a strong voice in how the harm is repaired. At the same time, it guides people who have committed harms to take a full and active form of accountability. Neighbor to Neighbor conducts RJ processes for juvenile crimes throughout the Mid-Valley, as well as community situations. We rely on trained volunteers to run these cases. This is a powerful way to give to your community, and a helpful skill set for anyone.

This training is essential for potential RJ volunteers, and valuable for educators, social workers, justice system professionals, or anyone else who wants to learn dialogue skills to better promote healing, accountability and repair. Participants can expect an engaging blend of small-group, large-group, and presentation times, along with role plays for experiential learning.
